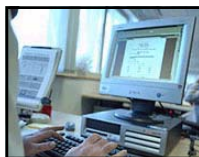

ST CHADS CHURCH GIVING

Each year we give 10% of our previous year's church income to various missionary societies, projects and individuals at home and abroad. The amount we give to different organisations for 2007 will largely be decided at the next PCC meeting on November 30th. The principles we have adopted to guide us are:

- * Our church giving should be broadly balanced between giving 'abroad' and 'home'.
- * Part of our giving 'abroad' should be to a Christian relief organisation such as Tear Fund.
- * As far as possible, we should try to limit the number of organisations and individuals we give to so that we are able to give substantial sums that really make a difference.
- * We will give priority to support organisations or individuals with whom we have a personal link.
